

Dairy, livestock meetings to be held March 2

UNIVERSITY PARK — Dairy and livestock producers may discover the advancements and opportunities that exist for animal agriculture in the 80's by attending Dairy and Livestock Day at Penn State University, March 2, 1981.

Sponsored by the Department of Dairy and Animal Science, this one-day symposium in the J. Orvis Keller Conference Center features two nationally prominent authorities on production livestock

and engery—Robert H Rumler and Rodney O. Martin. These men head a list of experts presenting the latest research findings in the dairy, beef, swine and sheep categories.

Rumler, Executive Chairman of the Holstein Association of America will discuss the "Challenges and Opportunities in Animal Agriculture in the 80's."

Martin, Director of Farm Systems Research and Develop-

ment for Agway, Inc., will present "Alternative Energy Sources and Energy Conservation in the 80's."

"Marketing Pennsylvania Beef in the 80's," "Grazing Studies with Dairy Animals," "Sheep/Forage Research for Small Farms" and "Artificial Insemination in Swine" are just a few of the many topics offered.

In addition to these informative sessions, the Dairy and Livestock Day offers producers, researchers and extension specialists a chance to interact.

Beginning at 9 a.m. with registration, the symposium is expected to adjourn at 3:30 p.m. To cover registration and instructional material costs, registrants are required to pay \$7 per person or \$10 for husband and wife or two persons from the same operation. Registration cost for 4-H or FFA students is \$3.

To attend the Annual Cattlemen's Banquet held at 7 p.m., an

additional registration fee of \$12 per person by February 26 is required. For advanced registration and additional in-

Dairymen to hold stray voltage meeting

LANCASTER — Dairymen are invited to attend a meeting on Mastitis Control and stray voltage at 1 p.m. on Friday, February 13 at the Lancaster Farm and Home Center.

The session is being conducted by the Lancaster County Extension Service. Penn State dairy specialists will lead the discussion.

Glenn Shirk, Lancaster County extension dairy agent, emphasizes the meeting should be of particular interest to dairymen who are experiencing high cell counts and

who have frequent mastitis flare-ups. It should also be of interest to dairymen who think they may be plagued with stray voltage problems.

Stray voltage problems have popped up in many areas of the county. Where it is a problem, cows may fail to respond normally to mastitis treatments.

They may be reluctant to enter the parlor, drink water or consume feed.

Cows may appear to be "on edge", stepping around or kicking at the milker, and failing to let their milk down normally. Cell counts may also be running higher than usual.
