

## Feed aid payments hit \$66.1 million

WASHINGTON, DC - The \$36.4 million received by U.S. livestock producers during December under the US Department of Agriculture's emergency feed aid program brings to \$66 1 million the amount of program payments in the first quarter of fiscal year 1981

The October through December payments are nearly triple the total paid out under the program during all of fiscal year 1980, according to Edward Hews, acting administrator of USDA's Agricultural Stabilization and

Conservation Service Hews said payments are heavy because of widespread drought conditions in the Midwest and the South

Hews said the \$66.1 million in

federal assistance has helped livestock producers buy 2 5 billion pounds of feed, about 44 million bushels corn equivalent Participants may be reimbursed for up to 50 percent of the cost of feed purchased The maximum authorized amount of cost share assistance was increased Aug 11,
