Therefore, some differences may be evident between this estimate and the actual return obtained by individual packers.

The value of hide and offal from the average 1,000 pound slaughter steer for the week ending Feb 13, was estimated at \$5.85 per 100 pound live weight compared with \$5.83 the previous week and \$6.65 a year ago.
