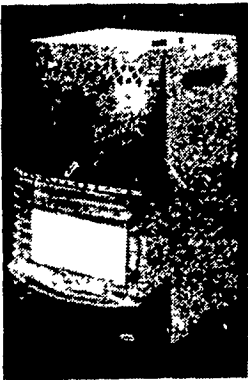

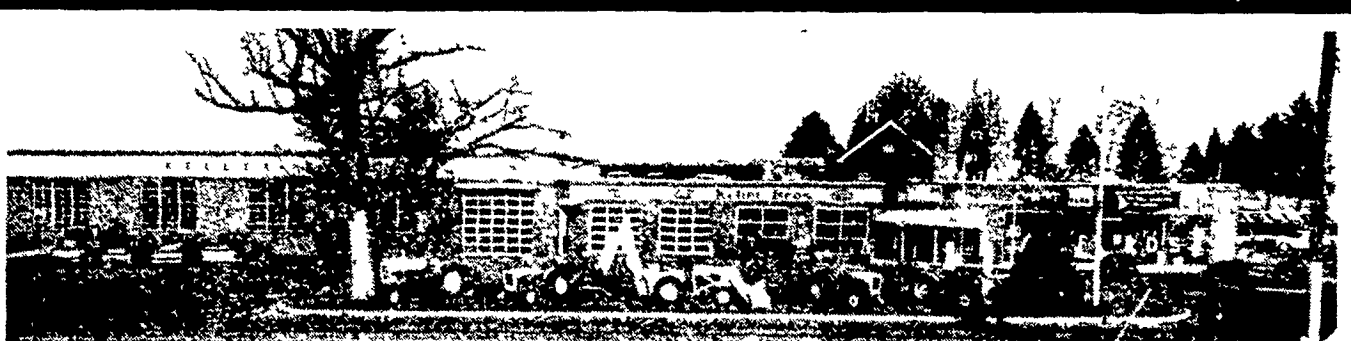
Many of us appreciate and use the Pennsylvania Grain Prices as published by Lancaster Farming

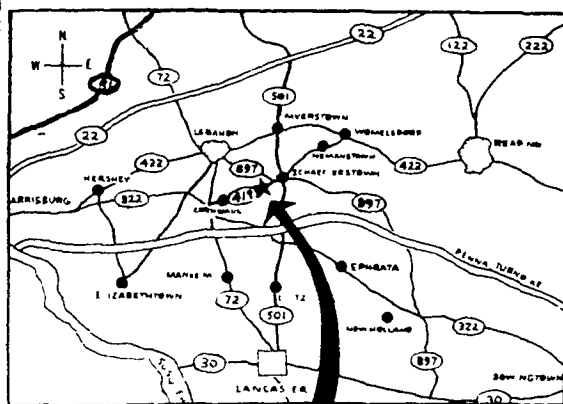
