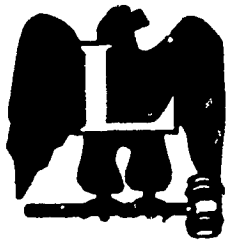

36,000 obtain firewood permits

HARRISBURG — More than 36,000 firewood permits were issued by the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Resources forest district offices during 1980, surpassing the 1979 record when more than 33,000 permits were processed. DER Secretary Clifford L. Jones said, "The 1980 record reflects the continuing efforts being made by the public to substitute wood as a fuel in place of natural gas, oil and electricity. "Until a few years ago, securing firewood from the state forests was a simple matter of collecting, or cutting, wood from areas near the forest roads. "Today there is little, if any, firewood to be found lying about on the forest floor. Standing timber, marked for cutting, may be some distance from the road. "This means more physical labor is involved but, despite this draw-back, there is no let-up in the issuance of permits and the trend may continue for the next several years." Jones said, "Making

use of the renewable natural resources of our forests not only represents a sizeable savings for the home owner but, by cutting out undesirable stand-

ing timber, also is a form of good timber management."

A total of 36,152 permits were issued last year for 73,900 standard

rough cords of firewood, compared to 33,555 permits in 1979 for 69,729 cords. In 1978 18,975 permits were issued for 37,728 cords of firewood.

Tips for safe use of gasohol

NEWARK, Del. — If you use gasohol, please recognize that you are dealing with a different fuel - one with a propensity to give off vapors, thereby generating pressure in storage tanks and equipment fuel tanks, says Delaware ex-

tension safety specialist Ronald C. Jester.

You may get leaks and condensation that you did not have before.

The performance of your tractor may be altered from familiar expectations. It may be more difficult to start in cold weather, and you

may have more problems with vapor lock in hot weather.

Be certain that your equipment is up to specifications. The exhaust, fuel, and electrical systems must be sound. Make certain, too, that the fuel tank filler cap fits properly and that the vent is open. Do not use non-standard caps or makeshifts.

Check with your dealer with respect to carburetor adjustments, timing, coolant temperatures, and such if you are not getting adequate performance. A 90-10 mix should work satisfactorily with little change in engine tune, but blends with a higher percentage of alcohol may require some carburetor and ignition modification for maximum efficiency.

Locate gasohol storage tanks where they are not exposed to the sun. Better yet, Jester suggests, have them underground. Avoid aluminum components in any part of the fuel storage and delivery system. Be sure venting is free, and watch for leaks.

Inspect the engine fuel system for leaks before each work day.

Do not remove the gas cap when the engine is running or hot. When taking the cap off, turn it slowly, and don't completely remove it until you are certain that no fuel will erupt from the tank.

Observe the usual safe practices when handling gasohol. Turn off the engine and allow it to cool. Do not smoke. Avoid pouring gasohol or refueling near sources of ignition.

Do not store gasohol in glass, plastic or flimsy metal containers. Keep small quantities only, in approved safety cans marked Gasohol, in a well-ventilated place.
