Pa. eggmen take over third place

LANCASTER - The increased continued its firm grip on the numbers on the Pennsylvania poultry scene have made their mark in national production figures

According to a report released earlier this month by US Department of Agriculture, Pennsylvania has moved into third place nationwide in egg production

Last year Pennsylvania laying operations produced 4.25 billion incredible, edible eggs

Top producer remained California which has an annual output of 8 8 billion eggs Georgia

second spot with output of 5.6 billion eggs

Arkansas, the third largest producer last year with an output of 415 billion, dropped to fourth place behind Pennsylvania

Nationwide, U.S. egg production made all-time highs USDA's Crop Reporting Board says the nation's laying flock produced 697 billion eggs during 1980

That's up 500 million from the 69 2 billion produced in 1979

Reason for the big increase is put at higher output per layer

Though the average number of

layers, at 285.2 million, was down nearly three million from the previous year's 288.6 million total, eggs per layer hit a record high of 244

This is significantly up from 1979's previous high of 240

Other high producing states include Indiana, fifth place with 3 7 billion, Alabama, 335 billion; North Carolina, with 317 billion moving up to seventh place, Texas, 31 billion moving up to eighth place, Florida, 3 04 billion, dropping from seventh to ninth, and Ohio, 2 33 billion, maintaining its hold on the number 10 spot
