

Missouri congressman to address E-town Young Farmers

717/367-3344 or 717/426-3554. Featured speaker for the evening is a U.S. Congressman from Missouri. Congressman Tom Coleman, 37, is serving his third full term as U.S. Representative from Missouri's 6th District. He serves on the House Agriculture Com-

mittee where he is ranking Republican member of the Subcommittee on Domestic Marketing, Consumer Relations and Nutrition. In this capacity he will be directly involved in the re-writing of food stamp legislation in the 97th Congress.

Coleman also serves on the Conservation, Credit and Rural Development Subcommittee.

Coleman's other Committee assignment is Education & Labor. The North Missouri Congressman also holds a

leadership post as Chairman of the Republican Foreign Policy Task Force. Through this crop, Coleman will be working with the White House and State Department in formulating a new, more consistent foreign policy.

Coleman was re-elected in 1980 with a 71 percent majority to lead all office-seekers running in North Missouri. He credits his support to his stands for a balanced federal budget, reduced federal spending to bring inflation under control, better conditions for America's

farmers and a strong national defense.

Prior to his election to Congress in 1976, Coleman served two terms in the Missouri State Legislature, and earlier was an Assistant State Attorney General of Missouri. He holds degrees from William Jewell College in Liberty; New York University, and a law degree from Washington University, St. Louis.

He and his wife, Marilyn, are natives of Kansas City, Mo. They have three daughters, Julie, Emily, and Megan.

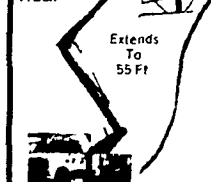

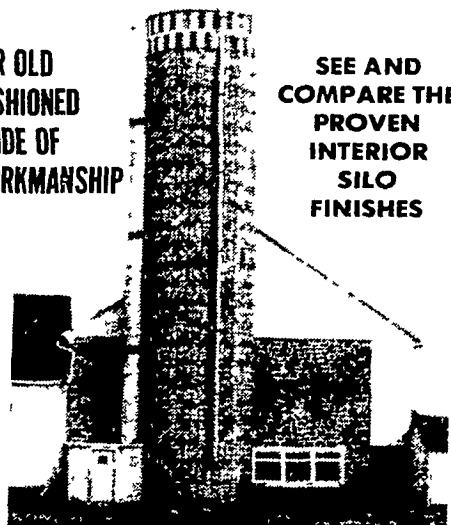

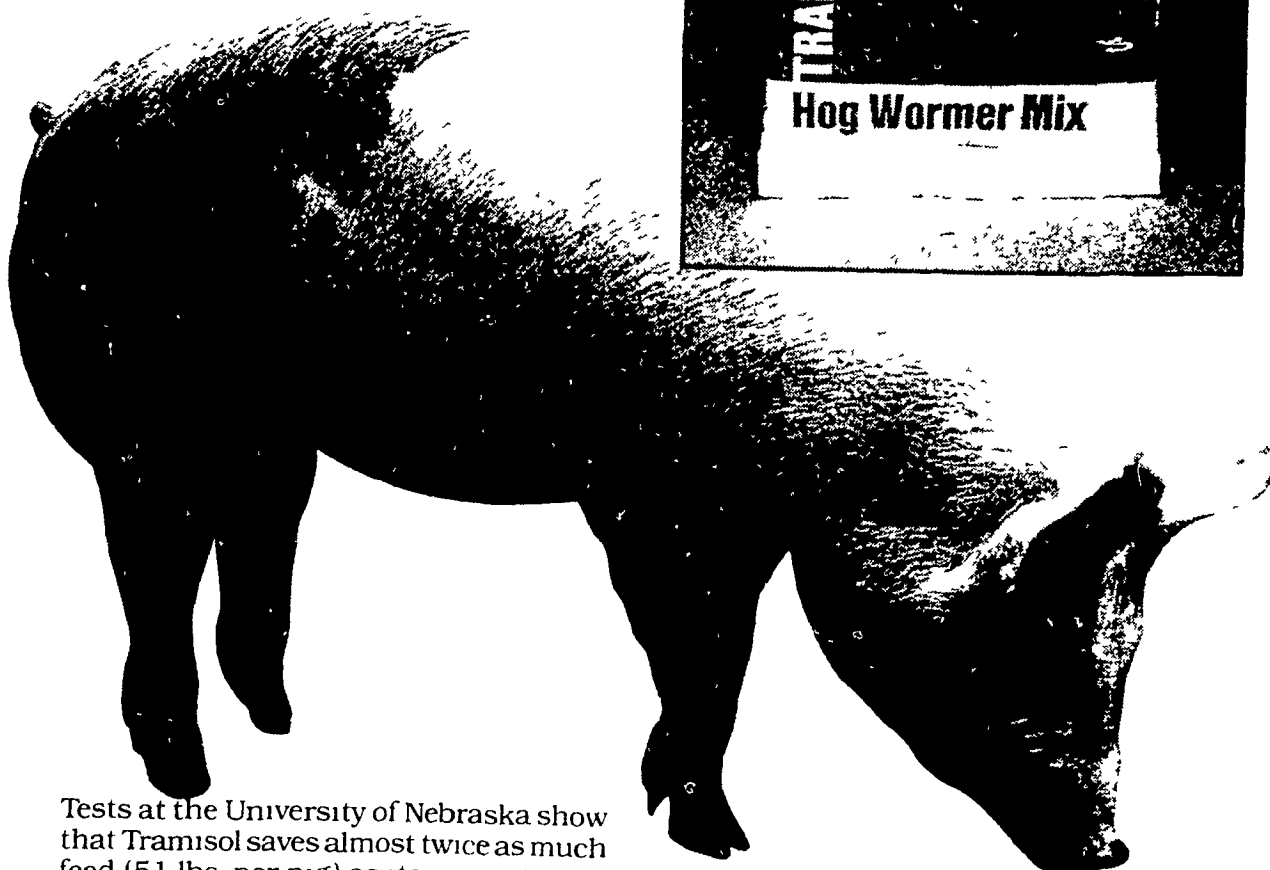
