

Fulton Grangers hear crime prevention talk

OAKRYN — Fulton Grange No 66 met in regular session Monday, 8 p.m. at the Grange Hall, Oakryn. Master Thomas C Galbreath conducted the business meeting.

Clifford Holloway Jr, chairman of the tour committee, announced that they are now taking reservations for a one-day trip to Tangier Island May 23. The bus will leave Quarryville at 6 a.m. and the Grange Hall at 6:15 a.m. and will return around 10 p.m.

The three-day trip to Virginia will be October 2, 3, and 4.

Clifford Holloway Jr and Jesse Wood reported attending a mushroom meeting. The growers are having financial problems. Foreign imports are affecting their prices. They are trying to expand their canned mushroom markets in foreign countries. Some Grangers were attending the Monday evening mushroom meeting.

A \$100 donation was given to the Pennsylvania State Grange Junior Grange promotional program for summer camp. Several officers and committee chairmen made plans to attend the Pennsylvania State Grange regional conference Saturday at West Chester.

Lecturer Mrs. Jesse Wood presented a Crime Prevention program. She introduced Harry Temple, chief police officer for Little Britain and Colerain Townships and a member of the Pennsylvania Crime Commission, who gave an interesting talk on the subject.

Colerain and Little Britain Townships have one full-time, two part-time and one volunteer police officer and have instituted a township Crime Watch in which private citizens are monitoring acts of crime. He asked for the cooperation of citizens in reporting suspicious activities to local and

state police.

Officer Temple and other local and state police will be launching an extensive crime prevention program soon. He told how to protect your home when you're away.

He said police will check your property if you notify them.

He explained Operation Identification. He said household items should be marked with your driver's license number, including the state abbreviation, rather than your Social Security number as was erroneously stated by the news media. Farm machinery can be marked with the Pennsylvania Crime code number. Local police will furnish equipment to mark your possessions and assign a Pennsylvania Crimes code number suffix to mark your machinery as well as supply Operation Identification stickers for your home.

Photographs of some things such as dishes and silverware are helpful in identifying them. Some of the latest items to be stolen are microwave ovens, portable heaters and guns.

Police Chief Temple said vandalism is causing terrific loss and that parents are responsible up to \$1000 damage. He gave out leaflets

on Crime Against The Elderly, Commercial Security, Vandalism, and How to make crime more trouble than its worth.

Police have films and slides available and movie projectors to show them at meetings.

Mrs. Wood conducted a communication game on a crime prevention story in which Peggy and Thomas C Galbreath, Richard Drumm Jr, Charles McSparran and William Rhoades took part.

The Solanco Ag Department will put on a parliamentary procedure exhibition at the next meeting March 9.

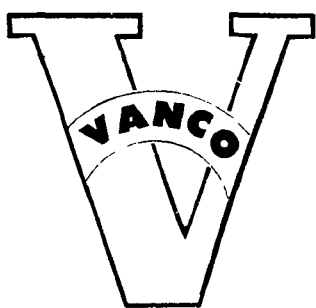
