Dauphin County to run tree seedling

HARRISBURG — In observance of Arbor Day, April 25, the Dauphin County Conservation District is conducting its seventh annual tree seedling sale. A county agency, the Conservation District was formed in 1952 to protect the county's natural resources.

Duayne Forsberg, Resource Specialist with the Conservation District, encourages county residents to take advantage of the seedling sale. According to Forsberg, "planting trees not only provides extra income when planted for timber production, but can also save you heating dollars when utilized for energy conservation."

Interested individuals should call 652-7073 or write to the Dauphin County Conservation District, Lower Paxton Township Municipal Building, 75 S Houcks Road, Suite 305, Harrisburg, 17109 to request an order form, prices and information.

The deadline for orders is April

6, 1981 and all orders must be picked up at the inside of the Colonial Park Plaza on Saturday, April 25, 1981, between 9 a.m. and 2 p.m.

Forsberg elaborated on the three to four year old bareroot seedlings for sale and a few benefits each provides. The conifers (douglas fir, blue spruce, white pine and norway spruce) average 12" in height, can be used for windbreaks and are among the most favored for Christmas trees.

The deciduous trees (red oak, white flowering dogwood, white

ash, black walnut, russian olive and scarlet maple) average 20" in height. When planted as shade trees, they act as "nature's air-conditioner."

Black walnut is the top money making tree due to its beautiful dark wood.


As a fuel source red oak has a rating of 26 million BTU's a cord, and white ash is rated at 23 million BTU's a cord.

White flowering dogwood and russian olive are the choices of bird watchers, since both are well liked by birds for their berries.

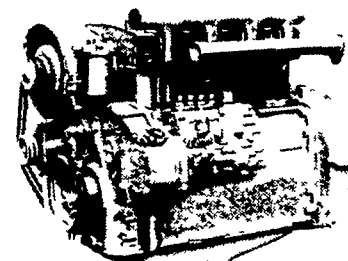

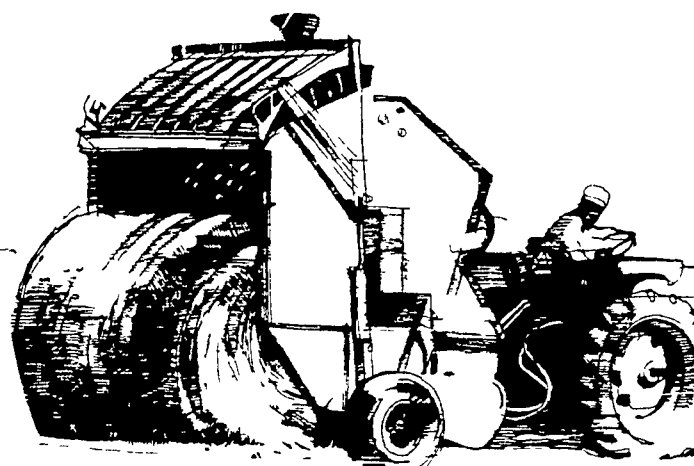
