

Flood insurance limits increased for Strasburg Twp.

LITITZ — Limits of flood insurance coverage have been increased for residents of Township of Strasburg, Lancaster County. This change, a result of conversion to the regular phase of the national flood insurance program, was announced by the federal insurance and mitigation office of the federal emergency management agency.

As a result of recent adoption, by elected officials, of measures to safeguard property from flooding,

expanded limits of coverage are made possible. Where previously only \$35,000 of coverage was available for a home, now \$185,000 coverage may be purchased. Also, increases in contents coverages from a previous \$10,000 to a present \$60,000 are available. Coverage increases for small business and other classes of structures are obtainable, too.

Information on rates and amounts of insurance available may be obtained from any licensed

property and casualty insurance agent. During the first thirty days after conversion to the regular program, coverage will become effective the day following application, whereas normally there is a five day waiting period.

There are beneficial exceptions to this rule which should be discussed with an insurance agent. Maps showing the flood-prone areas may be examined by interested individuals upon request to their local government officials.

Farm Bureau to back Reagan

WASHINGTON, D.C. — The president of the American Farm Bureau Federation has indicated support for President Reagan's program for economic recovery announced recently to the nation.

Robert B. Delano said farmers and ranchers support the administration's economic package of spending cuts, tax cuts, regulatory relief and stabilization of the dollar.

"We recognize that the nation's number one problem of inflation requires drastic action," Delano said.

Delano stressed the program must go through Congress as a total package to be effective.

You cannot have tax cuts without comparable cuts in federal spending if you expect to reduce inflation, balance the budget and provide for economic growth," said the head of the nation's largest farm organization.

The Reagan economic package also calls for reductions in the federal regulatory bureaucracy.

"This nation's farmers and ranchers greatly welcome the lifting of unnecessary, costly and counterproductive federal regulations," concluded Delano.
