

Penn State has short course on growing fruit

UNIVERSITY PARK and the trees are more subject to winter injury — Early spring is the best time to prune fruit trees," says Marshall Ritter professor of pomology at Penn State. Pruning should be done after the worst of winter has passed and before leaves come out on the trees.

In a Correspondence Course just updated by Ritter and titled Commercial Fruit Growing, he cautions not to prune trees while they are frozen because wood is liable to split

planting, soil management, pruning, packing and marketing of commercial fruits. Apples, peaches, pears, plums, cherries, and quinces are the fruits emphasized.

This 12-lesson course, intended for those in-

terested in growing tree fruits as a business, is available from Commercial Fruits, Box 5000, University Park PA 16802. A check for \$650 plus \$100 for handling should be made payable to Penn State.
