roasted manure contains between 27 and 37 percent crude protein, usually averaging 30 to 31 percent.

Burdette advised using poultry manure in feeding brood cows and grazing cattle but not heavyweight cattle, recommending the use of urea instead. Using urea in fattening cattle leaves more room in the rumen for other feed such as corn, Burdette said, and NPN sources of protein are cheap for fattening cattle "You want higher energy feeds in heavyweight cattle," he concluded.
