

Chester SCD seeks funds for White Clay Creek

WEST CHESTER — "Application is being made for funds for a land assessment survey of the White Clay Creek Watershed in Chester County", Pownall Jones, Chairman of the Chester County Conservation District told Directors at the District meeting last week in West Chester. The contract is being negotiated with the state Bureau of Soil and Water Conservation. "The assessment

would be a survey of the stream and surrounding land uses", Jones said. "The assessment will attempt to determine how much mud, if any, agricultural land is contributing to the White Clay Creek during storms. Property owners in the White Clay Watershed would be asked to assist in locating problem areas."

"Agriculture is nearly always pointed out as the culprit when pollution occurs in Chester County streams. Yet other stream studs in the past have shown that increased run-off from the impervious surfaces of shopping centers, roads and homes can contribute to the sediment load in the stream", Jones explained.

"Farmers are just as concerned about not damaging their neighbor's property as is the developer and the suburban land owner. With more and more people concerned about water quality, it seems that farmers would want to be above

reproach. They will want to do the best job they know how in managing their land," Jones concluded.

John Schueller, regional fieldman for the Department of Environmental Resources told Directors "that erosion/sediment inspection and enforcement program has been transferred from the Bureau of Water Quality to the Bureau of Soil & Water Conservation".

Townships that are now reviewing subdivision plans and giving approval for erosion/sediment and storm water management control can request the Bureau to transfer these inspection and enforcement powers to the township or municipality.

This would result in faster and more effective response for residents who report

damages from erosion/sediment and storm water control problems.

The Brandywine Valley Association is planning a complete implementation of its conservation plan for its new headquarters property for the week of April 21. This will be a demonstration of agricultural conservation practices.

Agricultural contractors have volunteered to provide operators and equipment for the two day affair.

Practices to be included in the construction according to Robert Struble, Jr., Executive Director of BVA, are terraces, waterways, strip-cropping, and no-till planting.

This will provide a training session for SCS personal and contractors. The Soil

Conservation Service, USDA, is a technical agency providing services for District cooperators. The new headquarters will be located between West Chester and Unionville on route 842.

Gerald Kelly, Service Forester, indicated that the Bureau of Forestry will conduct sessions on the care and management of woodlands. "With proper management, small woodlots can be an important source of fuel and lumber for the rural home", Kelly said.

"This will be an excellent opportunity for farmers and the public to observe the installation of agricultural conservation practices", Struble said. There will be guided tours of the project areas. Guides will explain the various operations. Exhibits are being planned on related environmental subjects, he explained.
