

Supports president's economic plans

EPHRATA — In an unprecedented move, the Board of Directors of PennAg Industries Association recently approved unanimously President Reagan's economic plans in their entirety as presented to Congress.

Morris Brown, Jr., currently president of the 500 statewide member organization, said he was grateful for the action.

"This is the first time in the history of this 102 year old organization where anyone can recall taking action on subjects with which we are not directly involved, as exemplified by the sweeping reductions in subsidies recommended throughout our entire communities of interest.

"But because the success depends upon the entire package being accepted and because we, together with the vast majority of last Fall's voters, feel that a complete change is mandated we

are willing to share our responsibility for some cuts," he said.

Specific areas which would affect the organization and its members are subsidy cuts for dairy price supports, low volume branch railroad lines, postal subsidies, alcohol fuels and conrail.

Brown stressed that while subsidy cuts will cause trauma in the short range, for agriculture and agribusiness the Penn Ag Board felt the basic economy would be stronger in the future.

In other action the Board re-elected William Sprenkle, Spangler & Sprenkle, York; and J.B. Pritts, Canonsburg Milling Co., Canonsburg, as trustees for the Penn Ag Industries Insurance Trust, which provides life, accident and medical benefits for employees and dependents of member firms.

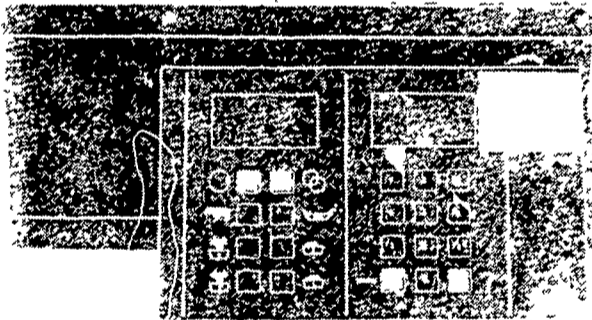

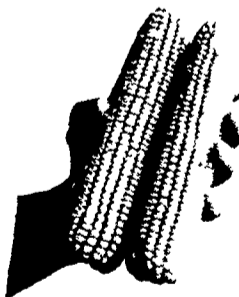
