Barton Smith, Chief Apiary Inspector for the Maryland Department of Agriculture, has compiled a bee colony rental directory which is free for the asking by folks interested in renting bee colonies to insure adequate pollination of fruits and vegetables.

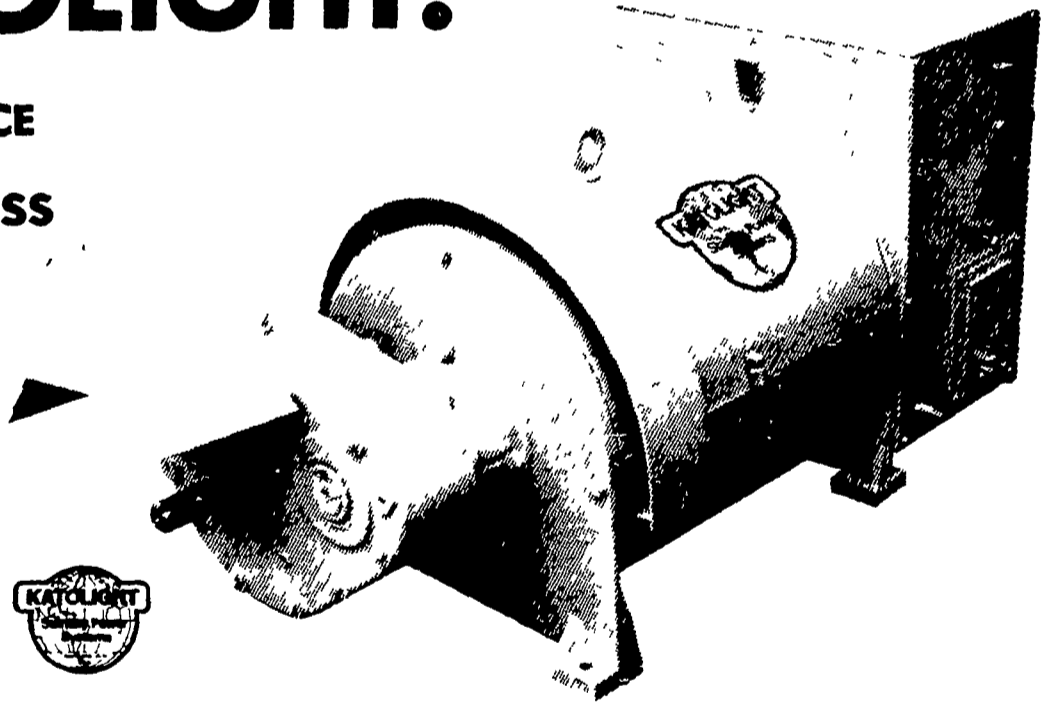
The directory lists dozens of beekeepers scattered across the state who are willing to lease their colonies to fruit and vegetable growers this year.
