Montgomery to offer horse judging clinic

NORTH WALES - The Montgomery County Equine Council and the Penn State Extension Service will sponsor a horse judging clinic on April 3 and 4 at Meadow Lane in North Wales. The clinic is open to all people interesting in becoming judges or who want to sharpen their judging skills.

Pete Cameron of St. Catherine, Ohio, Canada will be the instructor. Having been a registered udge in eight American Horse Shows Association divisions and a senior judge in numerous Canadian Horse Show Association divisions. Cameron has been one of the most sought-after judges throughout the nation.

He has officiated at such notable shows as the All American Quarter Horse Congress, State 4-H Horse Show in Harrisburg and the World Shows for the Arabian, Appaloosa and Quarter Horse Breeds Association.

Those persons participating in the clinic will mark an official card for each class. The placings will be compared to the official placings and scored, however, this is just as a learning experience and is not competitive.

Friday classes will cover discussion and class judging for Western Pleasure, Stock Seat Equitation, Quarter Horse conformation classes and a demonstration on Western Riding. The afternoon will be devoted to the Arabian and Morgan conformation program and will also include classes for Saddle Seat Pleasure and Equitation. A driving discussion will also be held.

Saturday will be devoted to hunter classes including judging the model hunter Performance classes will include Hunt Seat Equitation, Hunter Under Saddle, Pony and Horse Working Hunter.

Both days will begin with registration at 8:30 a.m. with the clinic starting at 9 a.m. until ap-

proximately 4 p.m. The course fee for advanced registration is \$25 for seniors (19 and older) and \$15 for juniors (18 and under) if checks are received by March 30.


