Joseph Mathis, economist for the Eastern Milk Producers Cooperative, spoke to area farmers on 1981 production status Thursday at the Blue Ball Fire Hall.

"I'm not trying to panic you, we're certainly not in trouble yet, but we have to realize the factors of over production," he explained.

"Because of the economy, there are fewer off-farm employment opportunities, so they're staying on the farm. This sluggish economy will hold farm numbers, so those who would otherwise sell to go to the city will just sit tight." The milk cow number is 20,000 more than the previous year and milk production per cow is up 2.1 percent over last year," he explained. "All these factors have encouraged over production."

"This year cows numbers will increase a bit and probably will be up two percent again," Mathis said.

"The surplus is going to be heavy this year I think and we don't have the plant capacity to hold all this milk," he said. "We have a hauling rate that borders on capacity now."

"We have a system for handling what we've got but if we have to ship somewhere else for some reason, we'll have some bottlenecks, some trouble. If something goes wrong in the plant, the milk will have to be shipped a longer distance."

As an example he referred to the Interstate Milk Producers Co-op which had to send excess milk to Wisconsin and Montana last April, emphasizing that trucks had to be brought back empty.

Finishing on a brighter note, Mathis commended the farmers on their excellent work saying that they can be proud of the "tremendous achievement in production from the dairy farmer."

"It's just phenomenal. No other area of agriculture begins to match the increase in production from the dairy industry."

Following this was a brief update on estimated uniform prices for 1981, to be published in this month's Eastern magazine.
