# Chester SCS to hold tree seedling sale

WEST CHESTER - The 1981 Annual Chester County seedling tree sale will be held in 14 locations around Chester County on April 17 and 18, Pownall Jones, Chairman of the Chester County Conservation District announced Tuesday.

Trees are obtained and distributed to civic organizations, Jones said. The organizations use the tree sales as a fund raising activity as well as helping residents aid the environment.

These trees can be used for wind breaks, Christmas trees, landscaping, wildlife protection, erosion control and screening around the homeowners property.

Varieties available will be Blue Spruce, White Pine, Douglas Fir, and Norway Spruce. A few locations will have Austrian Pine and Hemlock to provide sufficient quantities for the demand.

The seedlings will be packaged in bundles of ten trees for \$3 The Hemlocks will be slightly more.


