

## Carlisle man elected to wildlife board

CARLISLE — Leonard A. Green, of Carlisle, has been elected to the National Wildlife Federation's Board of Directors representing five mid-Atlantic states and the District of Columbia.

Green, director of public relations for the United Telephone System's eastern group, will serve as a regional director for Delaware, Washington D.C., Maryland, New Jersey, New York,

and Pennsylvania.

He was president of the Pennsylvania Federation of Sportsmen's Clubs, an NWF affiliate, from 1970 to 1972, and is president of both the Pennsylvania Fish Commission and the Pennsylvania Forestry Association. Green also serves on the Citizens Advisory Council to the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Resources and the Pennsylvania Environmental Quality Board.

For the past 25 years he has organized a series of County Youth Conservation Camps throughout the state.

The National Wildlife Federation, the nation's largest citizens conservation organization, also elected C. Clifton Young of Reno, Nev., as its new president. Elections were held at the concluding session of the Federation's 45th Annual Meeting in Norfolk, Va.

The Annual Meeting was attended by delegates from 53 states and territories who adopted 41 resolutions guiding Federation policy for the coming year.

Included were two which call upon the 97th Congress to reauthorize the Clean Air Act and the Clean Water Act without any amendments that would lower present air and water quality standards.

said, There's a lot more flexibility here than in the Peace Corps. It is good work for someone who wants to be in agriculture but doesn't want to go into research or big business agriculture.

Nabhan explained that the relief organizations have a low profile compared to the Peace Corps, therefore, they can confront political and food distribution problems that government-affiliated programs cannot touch.

Although Meals for Millions is an international organization, Nabhan works in Arizona on the Papago Indian Reservation near Tucson, where he has helped local farmers develop an innovative irrigation system.

Other international assistance organizations which have projects in the U.S. include the American Friends Service, the Save the Children Foundation and the American Field Service.

A Job Opportunities Bulletin is published monthly by the New Trans Century Foundation. It lists all of the jobs currently available in international development, a large percentage of which are in agriculture. Write Job Op-

In order to find jobs in agriculture, Vinsand of the U.S. Feed Ingredients Association, recommends contacting commodity associations, such as his, or the Woolgrowers or Soybean Associations.

It is not our main function, but we often serve as middlemen for agriculture companies that are looking for job applicants.

He also suggested writing to agricultural businesses in one's home state.

Galbraith got his job at Cargill by interviewing at a local Cargill office and then being recommended to people at headquarters in Minneapolis.

According to Vinsand, most large employment agencies located in cities have a person specializing in agriculture. Many agricultural companies advertise openings in the want ads of major midwestern newspapers, such as the Minneapolis Tribune, the Chicago Tribune and the Kansas City Times, which can be found in local libraries.

Agriculture trade magazines also publish job openings nationwide.

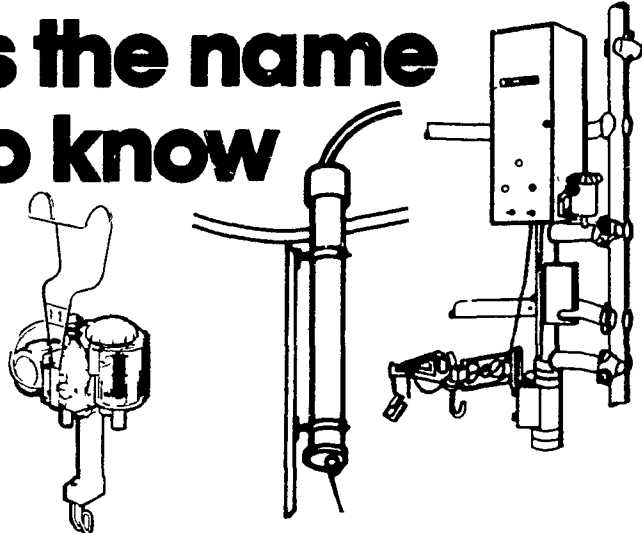

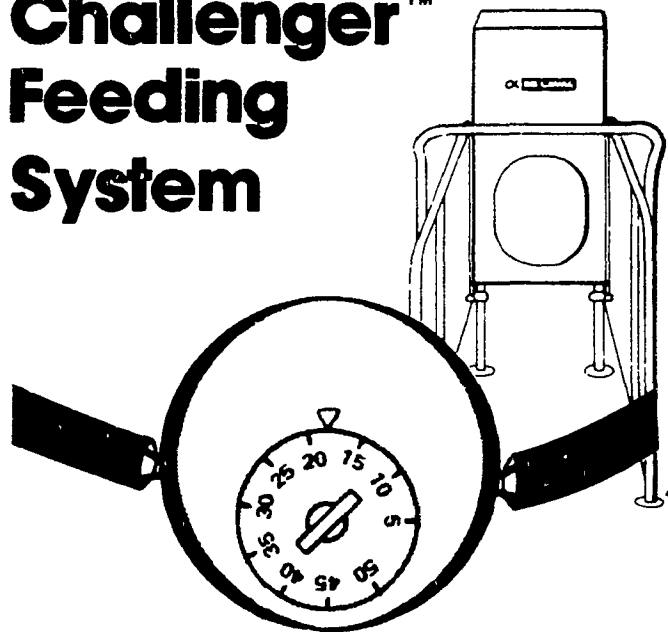
