TV station starts new program

PHILADELPHIA -Farmers, agriculturists and sharecroppers who want to stay informed with the latest in farm legislation, get an up-todate poultry report, and see how the fluctuation of prices is affecting crops can find it all in Gary Geers' "Farm Market Report," on Channel 3's (KYW-TV) new early morning news program, 3-today, 6:30 a.m. weekdays.

Geers, a 28-year veteran of KYW-TV, speaks with representatives from the field of agriculture, including experts associated with land grant colleges — Penn State University, Rutgers University, and the University of Delaware — who can bring early morning viewers up-to-the-minute reports affecting the farmer and the consumer.

In addition to Pennsylvania and New Jersey, reports include farm news from the states of Virginia, Maryland, and Delaware, and the crops grown in those states.

Each Friday, Geers and guest Frank Wiechec, director of the Philadelphia Produce Market, lets viewers know what is available in fresh produce markets especially those grown in the tristate area.

Early risers can also glean consumer-oriented information from Farm, Home & Garden, hosted by Geers, beginning at 5.49 A.M. weekdays. During this program, Geers offers cost-saving recipes, tips for tending home gardens, new ways to grow vegetables, and what's happening with pesticides and herbicides.
