## Deadline nears for crop insurance

LEESPORT — This might be the year for farmers to consider buying Federal Crop Insurance. Federal Crop Insurance can be purchased at most local ASCS offices.

Insurance is available until April 30 on corn and up to May 10 on soybeans.

Depending upon what levels of insurance coverage you decided to take, the rates for corn insurance are from \$3.70 to \$12.90 an acre.

The rates for soybean insurance range from \$2.10 to \$10.20 an acre depending on what option you choose.

Stop in at any ASCS office for any further information you may want or to have any questions you have on crop insurance answered

If farmers purchase crop insurance, they are also eligible to collect from the ASCS disaster program. However, unless the law is changed this will be the last year there will be an ASCS disaster program.

Federal Crop Insurance is also available at certain independent agents located thruout the state.
