The next regularly scheduled meeting of the Conodoguinet 4-H Sheep Club is slated for May 20 at the Monroe Township Municipal

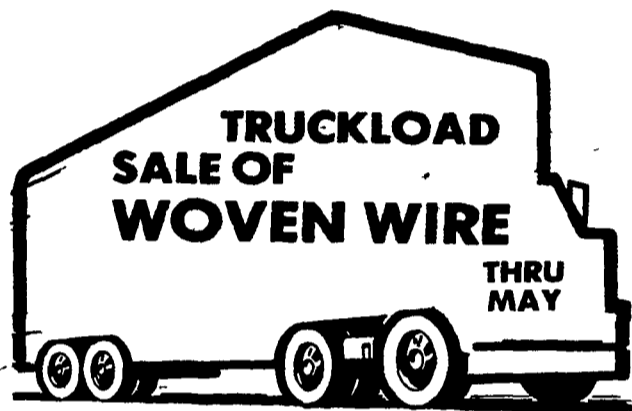
