PA BROILER PLACEMENTS DOWN ONE PERCENT HARRISBURG — Placements of broiler chicks in the Commonwealth during the

week ending April 25 were 2,456,000, according to the Pennsylvania Crop Reporting Service. The placements were one percent below the

corresponding week a year earlier but six percent above the previous week. Average placements during the past nine weeks were one percent above a year earlier.

Game protectors earn awards

HARRISBURG — Two of the Pennsylvania Game Commission's district game protectors have been honored for their outstanding work as wildlife conservation officers.

Northampton County District Game Protector Richard W. Anderson was named the wildlife conservation officer of the year by Shkar Safari Club International, and Juniata County District Game Protector Barry L. Warner was the recipient of the top officer award presented annually by the Northeast Conservation Law Enforcement Chiefs Association.

Anderson received his award at the convention of the Pennsylvania Federation of Sportsmen's Clubs at Carlisle, and Warner received his honors at the Northeast Fish and Wildlife Conference at Virginia Beach, Virginia.

Anderson has been with the Pennsylvania Game Commission since his enrollment as a student officer at the Ross Leffler School of Conservation (the agency's training school) in 1959. He was assigned to the district game protector's position in Northampton County in 1960, and has been there since that time.

Apple holdings up

HARRISBURG — Pennsylvania apples in cold storage on March 31 totaled 79,998,000, up 15,203,000 pounds or 23 percent from a year ago, according to the Pennsylvania Crop Reporting Service.

Of that total, which converts to 1,905,000 bushels at 42 pounds each, York Imperial apples comprise the largest variety in cold storage at 691,000 bushels.

Rome apples follow at 442,000 bushels, with holdings of Red Delicious apples at 302,000 bushels, and Gold Delicious apples at 264,000 bushels.

Apples in cold storage in the continental United States on March 31 totaled 35,297,000 bushels, up 10,378,000 bushels from a year ago.

Placements in the 21 key poultry producing states were 85,703,000, slightly below the previous week but four percent above the same week a year ago. Average placements in the 21 key states during the past nine weeks were three percent above a year earlier.
