Farm Show farmers' market opens

HARRISBURG — The Farm Show Farmers Market, offering consumers a chance to save money on farm fresh produce while enjoying the outdoors, began its seventh season this, week.

Pennsylvania' Agriculture Secretary Penrose Hallowell said, "In recent years, the rising cost of transportation has made direct farm marketing increasingly beneficial to both farmers and consumers by helping keep prices down." Pennsylvania is a national leader in direct farm marketing, he added, with annual sales from farmers markets, roadside stands, pick-your-own and milk jugging operations accounting for more than \$140 million in farm products sold.

Hallowell said the Farmers Market, located in the Farm Show parking lot, is open every Tuesday and Friday between 3 and 8 p.m. through November.

(Continued from Page D21) researchers were dedicated and maintained good relationships with their clientele, the growers," comments Bergman.

He and the other researchers will make only one trip to Uruguay, but the program does not end at that point. "Most of the work is completed by correspondence. The Las Brujas research station's leaf analysis, for example, is augmented by running similar tests at Penn State and sending back the results for comparison,' explains Bergman.

Following the work in Uruguay, the Penn State horticulturists traveled on his own to Argentina to evaluate the work he had done there in the late 60's and early 70's. The goal of that program, spon-sored by Penn State and an Argentinian science and agriculture institute, was to alleviate fruit-nutrition problems and to set up a plant analysis system and laboratory in the Rio Negro Valley of Argentina.

"At the time, we found heavy metal deficiencies and high soduum COD in the soil. I returned this year to find out if our research and recommendations cre-ated positive results," says Bergman. He saw a tremendous improvement in the Argentinian's apple production. The plant analysis lab, maintained at full operation since 1973, operates as an important information center for growers. "The fruit trees didn't suffer from earlier deficiencies. When we first began working here in the 60's, the Argentinians diagnosed soil problems as a potassium deficiency. 'In our analysis we discovered that symptoms of what looked like potassium deficiency

were actually caused by a sodium excess and high soil salt concentrations," explains Bergman. Fertilizer recommendations were adjusted, and when diammonium phosphate became available, nutritional problems decreased considerably.

Bergman was the first Penn State researcher to return to evaluate the progress of the apple production.

e "I was glad to return and assess their fruit e program and pleased by the friendly welcome I s received," he concludes.
