

Jersey Annual Meeting set for June 15-17

COLUMBUS, Ohio — The American Jersey Cattle Club, Columbus, Ohio, the oldest dairy breed organization in the Western Hemisphere, will hold its 113th Annual Meeting in Woodstock, Vt., June 15-17.

National All-Jersey Inc., the Jersey milk marketing organization, will hold its 23rd Annual Meeting the same week. Headquarters for both will be The Woodstock Inn.

Official business begins Tuesday, June 16, with the National All-Jersey Breakfast and Annual Meeting. Featured speaker will be C. A. Ernstrom, head of the Nutrition and Food Sciences Department at Utah State University.

Tuesday evening will be capped off with the Annual Jersey Breeders Banquet. W.L. Payton, Stephenville, Tex., will be honored as Master Breeder and Harold B. "Tuffv" Wright, White River

Junction, Vt., will be given the Distinguished Service Award.

The final morning, Wednesday, June 17, will feature the AJCC Awards Breakfast. Three production awards and five Outstanding Young Dairymen awards will be presented.

The AJCC Annual Meeting will follow. Featured speaker will be Dr. Paul T. Chandler, a widely-known nutritional consultant from Dresden, Tenn.
