Yearling ram sale, field day coming

STATE COLLEGE - Rising costs of production have made selective buying of quality livestock a must for farmers, according to State Agriculture Secretary Penrose Hallowell.

"Performance testing programs are an excellent means of comparing individual quality and performance of stud rams under similar conditions," Hallowell said. "Pennsylvania sheep producers will have the opportunity to purchase tested prospects at the Fifth Performance Tested Yearling Ram Sale, June 6 at the Department's Mean Animal Evaluation Center, State College "

The sale, held in conjunction with 1981 Pennsylvania Sheep Field Day, begins at 2 p.m. Field Day activities focus on lamb marketing, on-foot and carcass grading, feeding and improving lamb production through breeding. The Field Day site is Penn State's Beef and Sheep Center.

All rams have been ultrasonically scanned to determine fat thickness and loneye area. Soundness, rate of gain and index scores are also available.

Forty-three yearing rams were placed on test February 1981. Their average daily gain at the end of the 84-day test period was 0.95 pounds.

Thirty-one of these rams will be offered for sale June 6. Breeds to be sold include Corriedale, Dorset, Shropshire, Southdown and Suffolk.
