TURKEYS: Supplies no more than adequate for a moderate demand. Estimated slaughter today 73,000 head.

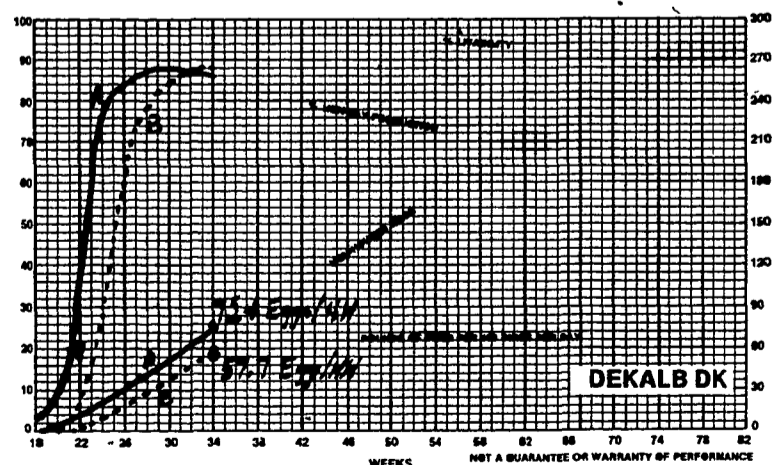
