Dan Bansen, Forest Glen Jerseys, Dayton, Ore., in partnership with his father, Stan, owns 450 Jerseys of all ages, with more than 200 cows going through the parlor

The 1980 DHIR herd average was 15,989 pounds milk and 787 pounds fat on 233 lactations, placing them second for milk and fat in the nation, regardless of herd size.

Currently, Dan is vice president of the Oregon State and Williamette Valley DHIAs. He was general chairman of the 1980 AJCC-NAJ Annual Meetings which were held in Portland.

Dan and nis wife, Judy, have three young daughters.

While working as herdsman for Bennett and Thomas Holsteins, Madison, Ga., and then the North Carolina State University Randleigh Farm, Major and Lou Bond saved all the money they could in hopes of someday purchasing Jerseys and running their own

Carcass lamb show to be held

The live lamb classes will be held on Tuesday, June 16 at 6:30 p.m., at the Montgomery County 4-H center, located on Snyder road, just off Valley Forge Road (Route 363), approximately 1/2 mile south of Lansdale between route 63 and Allentown Road.

The results of the "on-rail" carcass show will be presented on Thursday, June 18 at 7 p.m. at the Gehman Meat Plant, located in Morwood, Montgomery County.

All participants will be given the opportunity to judge all classes



along with the official and assign a quality grade to each lamb.

There will be three classes of lambs and each lamb will be judged live first. Each lamb will then be slaughtered and the carcass and yield grades recorded.


