

## Antlerless license distribution returns to Potter Co.

HARRISBURG — 1981 Potter County antlerless deer licenses will be issued from the courthouse at Coudersport under the direct supervision and control of the

Game Commission. The return to Coudersport was authorized by the Game Commission in direct response to a request from the Potter County Commissioners.

Last year, Potter County antlerless permits were issued by the Commission from its Northcentral Field Division office at Jersey Shore following an incident in which the county treasurer was removed as an issuing agent of the Commonwealth. He had been charged by the State Justice Department and Game Commission with numerous irregularities in connection with the distribution of 1979 antlerless

licenses. The case remains in litigation.

Recently, the Potter County Commissioners met with Game Commission officials and an agreement was developed whereby the physical distribution of the 1981 permits would be conducted from the courthouse at Coudersport with space and personnel supplied by the county. Game Commission officers will supervise distribution.

Applications, which will be received by first class mail, on a first-come-first-served basis, should be mailed to the Potter County treasurer's office. 1981 applications for antlerless licenses in all counties begins Monday, October 5.

## Penn State studies bagged silage

UNIVERSITY PARK — Farmers may have another method to ensile forages, if tests of bagged silage continue to show favorable results, says Lowell L. Wilson, professor of Animal Science at Penn State.

An alternative to conventional silos, the bags give farmers

flexibility to handle more silage in a given year without building a new silo, he observes.

"In a case where the producer is enlarging his operation, say from 40 to 60 dairy cows, or from 200 to 300 finishing steers, the silage-bagging system may be more economical and flexible than investing

in a new conventional silo," Wilson says, adding he foresees some farms using only bagged silage.

Although the machine is relatively expensive, and the system requires the farmer to buy new bags each year, generally the bagging technique may be less costly and offers greater flexibility than the construction of a new silo, especially if the machine can be rented through a custom operator, he claims.

Bagged silage may not be economical for every farm situation, but Wilson reports Pennsylvania farmers who have tried the system seem to be pleased with it.

A large "sausage-stuffing machine" packs 100 to 125 tons of plant materials into an airtight plastic bag that is about 8 feet in diameter and 100 feet long. The bag is sealed by nailing 2x4's together across the open end or tightly folding the end down and placing something heavy, like old tires or soil upon it.

After fermentation occurs, farmers can slit the end of the bag and peel the ends back. The silage can then be removed with a front-end loader. The bag can be refolded to maintain nearly air-tight conditions. Generally the bags are not re-used.

Anhydrous ammonia and other additives could also be used to retain or improve the nutritional quality and palatability of the bagged silage. Although the silage spoiled a little more than Wilson had anticipated, its quality paralleled that of silage from conventional silos. He attributes the spoilage to the fact that the test batches filled only a portion of the bag. However, Wilson found that beef cattle readily accepted the feed and performed well on it.

This research is a part of a larger team project involving W.L. Kjelgaard and P.M. Anderson, associate professors of Agricultural Engineering and H.W. Harpster, assistant professor of Animal Nutrition. Also being studied is the use of the large round bales for silage storage in plastic bags.
