

## Montgomery Co. reminds farmers to enroll in 5-acre Corn Club

NORRISTOWN — Corn producers in Montgomery County wishing to enter the Five-Acre Corn Club, sponsored by Penn State Cooperative Extension

Service and the Pennsylvania Master Corn Growers Association, should file an official entry form by contacting Paul Reber at the Cooperative Extension Office no later than July 1.

and a complete Penn State soil test must have been taken within the last 2 years. If the corn is grown in contour strips, 2 to 3 strips on the same slope may be used as long as the combined acreage is 5 acres or more. Plant leaf mineral analysis for 13 elements and a cost of production budget will be available as options for 1981 Club members.

The entire acreage must be planted to one variety of corn. Irrigated fields cannot be entered.

There are two classes — an ear corn harvested class and a shelled grain harvest class.

Any farmer or farm operator who is 18 years of age or older by August 1, 1981, is eligible to enroll. There is no charge for entering the Corn Club. Only one entry is allowed per farmer or farm operator — if more than one farm is involved.

The field must be 5 acres or more

## Ag Department heads convene in S. Carolina

ANNAPOLIS, Md. — Southern agricultural leaders including Wayne A. Cawley, Jr., of Maryland are meeting this week in Myrtle Beach, South Carolina.

Mary C. Jarratt, Assistant Secretary of Agriculture for Food and Consumer Services will speak along with Dr. Harry Mussman, Director of the Animal and Plant Health Service.

"We have got a lot of work to do at this Conference," said Wayne A. Cawley, Jr. "The subject of agriculture is of vital concern to all of us and a meeting like this serves to keep us better informed about what is taking place on both a regional and a national level."

As they begin the 82nd Conference of the Southern Association of State Departments of Agriculture, the agricultural chiefs, who represent the fifteen southern states, will review legislative activities of the various states and will listen to the reports of USDA representatives from Washington, D.C.

with tractors." Ollie Ziegler, DeWitt, president of the Missouri Draft Horse Association, told those attending the Seminar that his association was active and that horses were still an important part of the Missouri picture.

One recent estimate indicates 200,000 horses and mules are owned by over 87,000 different people in Missouri.

"The horses are used mostly for play and show—to pull wagons in parades, for commercial hay rides, etc.," Bradley said. "But there are a fair number that are used for logging and farming."

As for mules...well, they're something else. The result of a cross between a horse mother and jackass father can't reproduce but is sexually aggressive nevertheless.

"Mules stole the show at the Seminar—as I thought they might," Bradley said.

One good reason is that Gene Chupman and Richard Kohl were there from Perry, Mo.

They've shown mules about 30 years at the Missouri State Fair and won more grand championships there than any one else.

"They'll tell you that a state championship at the Missouri State Fair is like a world championship, because the best mules are in Missouri," Bradley said. "I can't argue with them."

The "star" of the Missouri Seminar was the one-month-old mule foal of a Belgian mare.

"That foal attracted a lot of attention. I guess there is a certain magic about mules," Bradley said.
