Storage affects swine manure

NEWARK, Del. — The fertilizer value of swine manure increases as other crop nutrients become more costly. Once considered more of a liability than an asset, manure can improve the chemical and physical properties of the soil, if managed properly, says University of Delaware Extension livestock specialist Richard Fowler.

A recent analysis showed one swine manure lagoon contained \$25,000 worth of

nitrogen phosphorus and potassium.

"It's nice to know pigs are paying for something these days," notes Fowler.

Swine manure value depends on several factors, he says. The kind and amount of feed, collection method, type of storage, application method, and crop receiving the manure all affect its final worth.

"If the ration you feed uses a heavy metal additive and you apply manure heavily, use a

soil test to monitor the situation," he advises. Heavy metals such as arsenic and copper used as feed additives can be toxic at high levels in the soil.

Straw, sawdust, shavings, and water all dilute manure, reducing its benefit as fertilizer. Feed wastage into a manure storage pit increases nutrient concentration, but this isn't an economical way to fertilize, Fowler notes.

How swine manure is stored has a lot to do with its fertilizer value.

An anaerobic pit is best. A lagoon is the poorest method, Fowler claims.

Approximately 80 percent of the N is lost from manure stored in a lagoon, while only 25 percent is lost in an anaerobic pit. An open lot system with scraping and hauling results in approximately 50 percent N loss.

Phosphorus and potassium can be retained with a runoff control system. In a lagoon most of the P settles into the sludge layer and is unavailable if only the liquid portion is applied to the land.

For maximum benefit the manure must be promptly incorporated into the soil, says Fowler. In many parts of Delaware, incorporation is immediate because swine manure odors don't mix well with outdoor summer activities. Equipment that injects the manure into the soil saves time but requires a big tractor and more capital initially.

Apply manure evenly to help assure uniform germination and yields. Spread it as close to the planting date as possible. Avoid immediate planting after heavy manure application. Labor and field conditions often require that manure be spread in the fall or winter.
