# USDA cites Pa. produce firm

PALM - Conts, Inc., has been cited by the U.S. Department of Agriculture for failing to pay promptly for tomatoes it purchased for its processing operations.

USDA's Agricultural Marketing Service, which licenses produce firms under the Perishable Agricultural Commodities Act, had charged the firm with failing to make full payment for 250 lots of tomatoes worth \$165,928. The tomatoes were purchased during August and September, 1979.

Charles Brader, marketing official with AMS, said the firm had the opportunity to answer USDA's charges, but failed to respond.

USDA's Administrative Law Judge William J. Weber ruled that the firm had committed willful,

flagrant, and repeated violations of the act.

Under Weber's order, the firm is ineligible to conduct business subject to the act until May 1983, and then only if a PACA license is obtained. The firm's officers and directors — James L. Price, George H. McLaughlin, and Samuel J. Schreffler may not be employed by or affiliated with any PACA licensee until May 1982, and then only if a surety bond is posted

and USDA approves. Also, the firm's sole major stockholder, American Specialty Foods, Inc., may not be affiliated with any PAČA licensee during the same period.

Under PACA, all interstate traders in fresh and frozen fruits and vegetables must be licensed by USDA. USDA is authorized to suspend or revoke a trader's license for violating the act.

questions about farm problems and farm policy. As indicated, they may not be typical, but they are important. Some of them and the organizations they belong to will be in Washington over the next several months making sure farm policies get written that suit them.


It seems almost inevitable that large farms will get 1 rger and more and more small farms will be gobbled up by developers and other farmers.

But at the same time, it does seem possible that Uncle Sam will

write some laws that could change all that. There is a body of evidence summarized in the USDA farm structures report that indicates continuing the trend toward larger farm units may not be all that good for agriculture or for America. And there seems to be a growing national concern about farmland preservation and soil stewardship.

Perhaps all of these factors will come together in a new farm bill with some totally new approaches to some of agriculture's problems.


