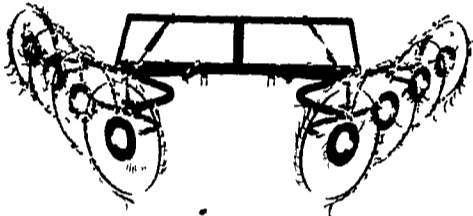
The Foodarama judging team, composed of Beth Ann Shiner, Troy Funk, Karen Arnold and Debbie Bolles earned first place in the Regional contest.

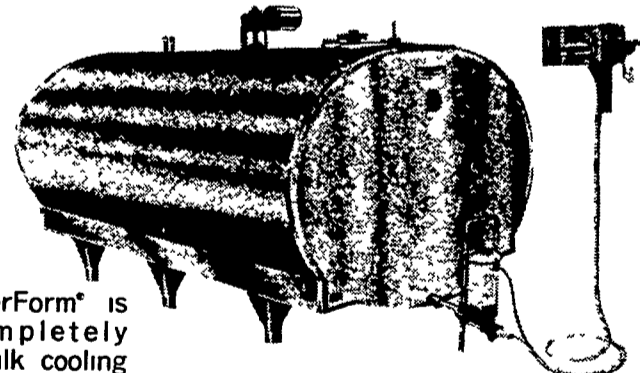

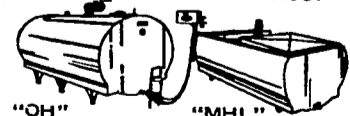
