Total premiums for all events at the 1981 North American International Livestock Exposition will hit an all-time show record of over \$300,000.

Kentucky Council on Agriculture and 1981 marks the expo's eighth consecutive year of operation. It will be held at the Kentucky Fair and Exposition Center, Louisville, Kentucky.

Attendance at the 1981 North American International is expected to exceed the record setting 100,000 mark set last year. Show visitors and exhibitors will come from every state in the nation and over 15 foreign countries.

feed purchases", you say. You can't? Let's explore this a little further with some assumptions and examples. Let's assume you can purchase most of your hay needs now for about \$30,000, but that you'll have to borrow \$30,000 for 9 months at 16% interest to do it. The other option is to buy it as you need it - when everybody else

needs it, too and is bidding up the price; it may then cost you 20% more; that's \$6,000 added feed cost compared to \$3600 interest on \$30,000 at 16% for nine months. If you can get your cows to produce just 2 pounds of milk more per cow per day because you are now able to balance your ration properly, that is another \$75 bonus per cow!

Think twice before you say you can't afford to borrow money or to take the time and effort necessary to tend cows properly so they'll have an opportunity to produce well and return you a profit.
