jured in the same way on the day of his 56th birthday. An inexperienced person was driving the tractor, and Nichols was riding along on the bumper to give directions. Suddenly the un-thinkable happened - Nichols tell off and was run over by the huge machine. His abdomen was crushed, necessitating a long stay in a body cast. His broken leg

never did heal correctly, and to this day he can't do any lifting.

"On a small tarm like ours," she says, there is no-one to tell you to be careful. You have to be aware yourself. Now when I go to a tractor pull and see someone casually jump onto a moving tractor, I want to shoot my mouth off. I know what can happen."

Art Hoffman looks at tarm safety from another perspective that of dollars and cents. Hotfman represents the Farm Family Mutuai Insurance Company, which

is the insurance arm of the Farm Bureau.

Farmers who have workmen's compensation policies with Farm Family Mutual may apply for membership in the Workmen's Compensation Safety Group. The purpose of the group is to cut down on accidents, thereby reducing the members' insurance premiums.
