Mississippi Charolais is Sterling Dam

HOUSTON, Tx. — A purebred fifth and qualifying calf on November 5, 1980 resulting in a calving interval of 377 days. Her 5 Charolais cow, owned by Malcolm Commer, Jr. of Jonestown, Ms., is American-International Charolais Association's 65th Sterling Dam of Distinction.

The cow Ms Schultz Sam 67 353S4, F 228803, was sired by Schultz Sam 67 625S, M 103029 and is out of the cow Miss Charolais S776, RF138600. Commer is the owner of Fairfield Plantation near Jonestown, this is their first Sterling Dam.

To qualify for this award, a registered purebred Charolais dam must produce 5 calves by the time she is 7 years old, with each calf having an adjusted 205-day weaning weight ratio of 101 or greater. In addition, the cow must have a regular calving interval. Twin calves are counted as one calving and no ovum transplants are eligible. Owners of the dams that qualify for these awards receive an official certificate.

Ms Schultz Sam 67 was born on February 25, 1974, had her first calf on September 7, 1976, and her

calves averaged 666 pounds at weaning, 9 percent above the average of their 276 contemporaries.

The Sterling Dam's sire and her dam's paternal grand-sire was the well-known 'Sam' bull, FWT Bar 951, M 2792, bred by 4T Ranch, Inc. of Austin, Tx. Sam 951 and his progeny sired 8 of the first 12 International Grand Champion Charolais, set 12 Performance Registry International performance, production, and carcass records, and his male progency have formed the nucleus for several renowned Charolais bloodlines in the United States. In addition, Sam 951 was the first bull of any breed to be awarded PRI's 100 percent Golden Certified Meat status.

Fairfield Plantation is enrolled on AICA's Charolais Herd Improvement program and has participated in testing bulls on the Charolais Sire Evaluation Program.
