## Fusarium blight thrives in continuous no-till beans

NEWARK, Del. — There are many good reasons for growing no-till soybeans, but growing them continuously for too many years on the same soil may increase the

incidence of Fusarium blight disease, according to Delaware Agricultural Experiment Station plant pathologist Robert Carroll. Carroll has been growing no-till soybeans at the University's Georgetown Substation for several years.

Carroll's plots feature Essex and Williams soybeans grown under both no-till and conventional tillage after wheat and barley. Visitors to the University's Farm and Home Field Day can see for themselves that the incidence of Fusarium blight is higher on the continuous no-till plots.

Carroll considers Fusarium blight to be the main disease threat to soybeans in the Mid-Atlantic

region right now. In heavily infested areas, losses may run as high as 20 to 25 percent, although losses of 5 to 10 percent are more typical. The disease easily represents a loss of two or three bushels per acre.

The best way to control a pathogen like Fusarium is to plant resistant varieties, Carroll says. Farmers can find out which varieties are doing best by taking note of the soybean variety trials that will also be featured at Farm and Home Field Day.

Field day will take place on Wednesday, August 12, at the University of Delaware's Georgetown Substation. Hours are from 9:30 a.m. until 3:30 p.m.

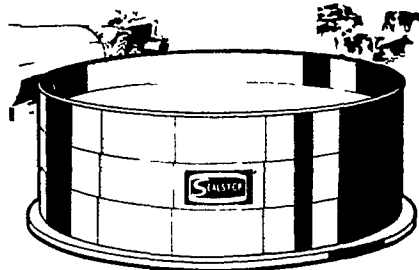

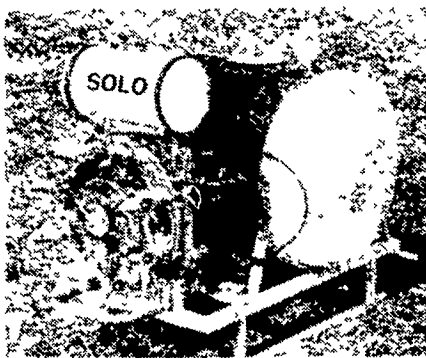

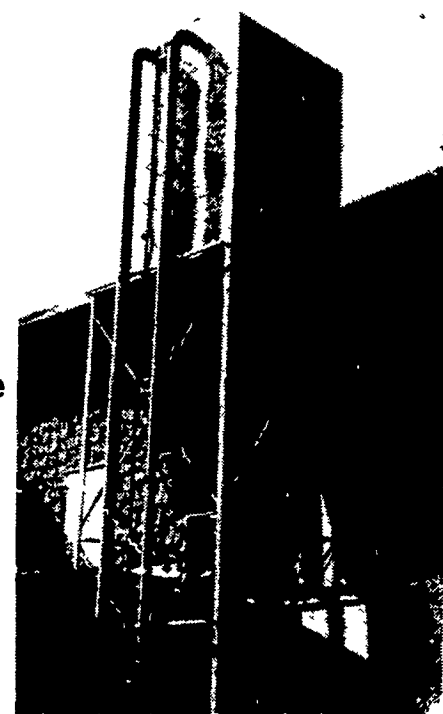
