BALTIMORE, Md. - Most of the formal meetings, most co-op member reaction to the proposed consolidation between the Maryland Cooperative Milk Producers and Dairymen, Inc., a large southeastern co-op appears fairly positive, an MCMP spokeswoman said recently.

MCMP Public Relations Director Susie Richburg explained that due to a series of local inmembers understand the basics of the pending merger.

The final district meeting will be. a District 4 gathering at the Walkersville Carnival Ground in Frederick County, Md. on Monday, August 17 at 8:00.


