— Barbara Green, Warriors, Center County, high individual in horse judging.

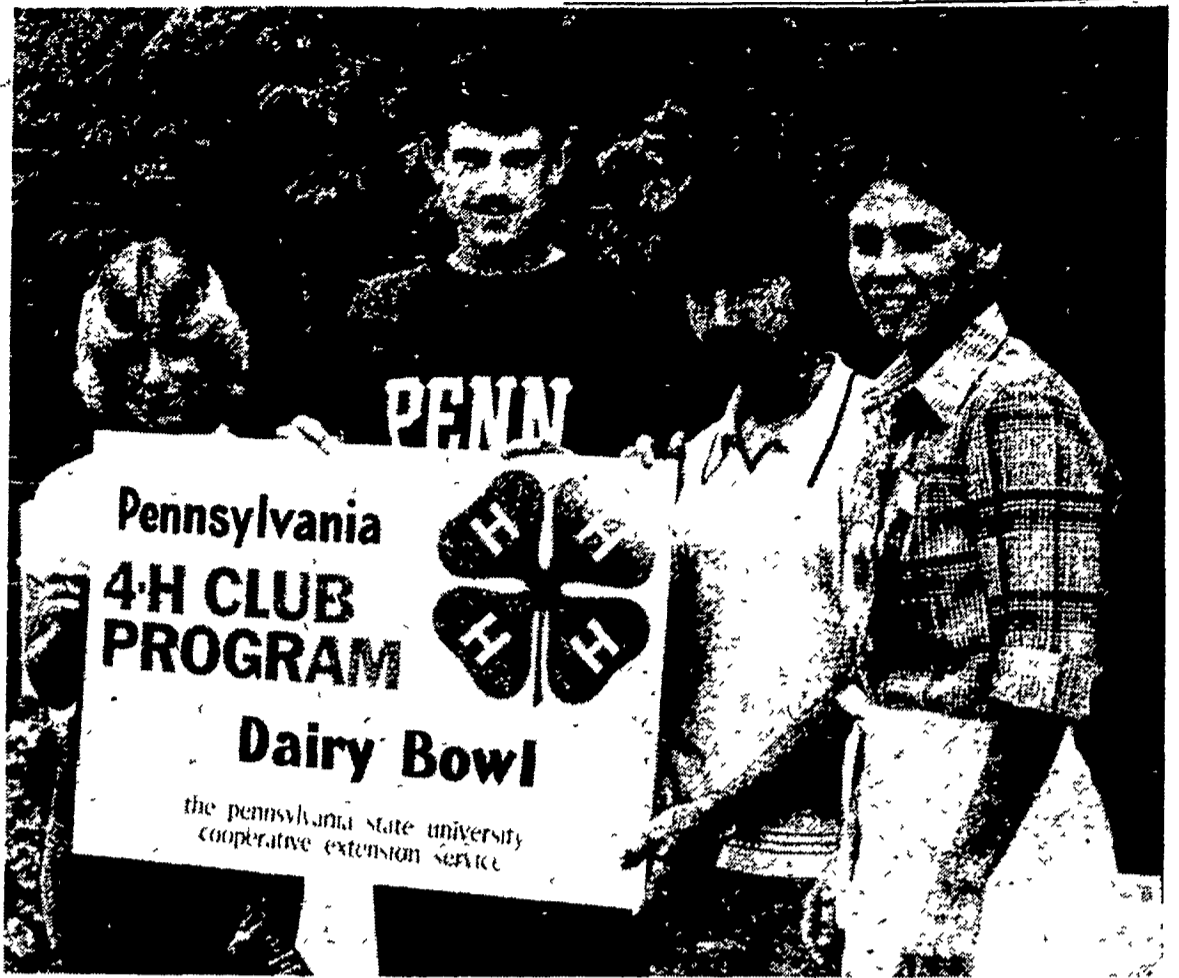

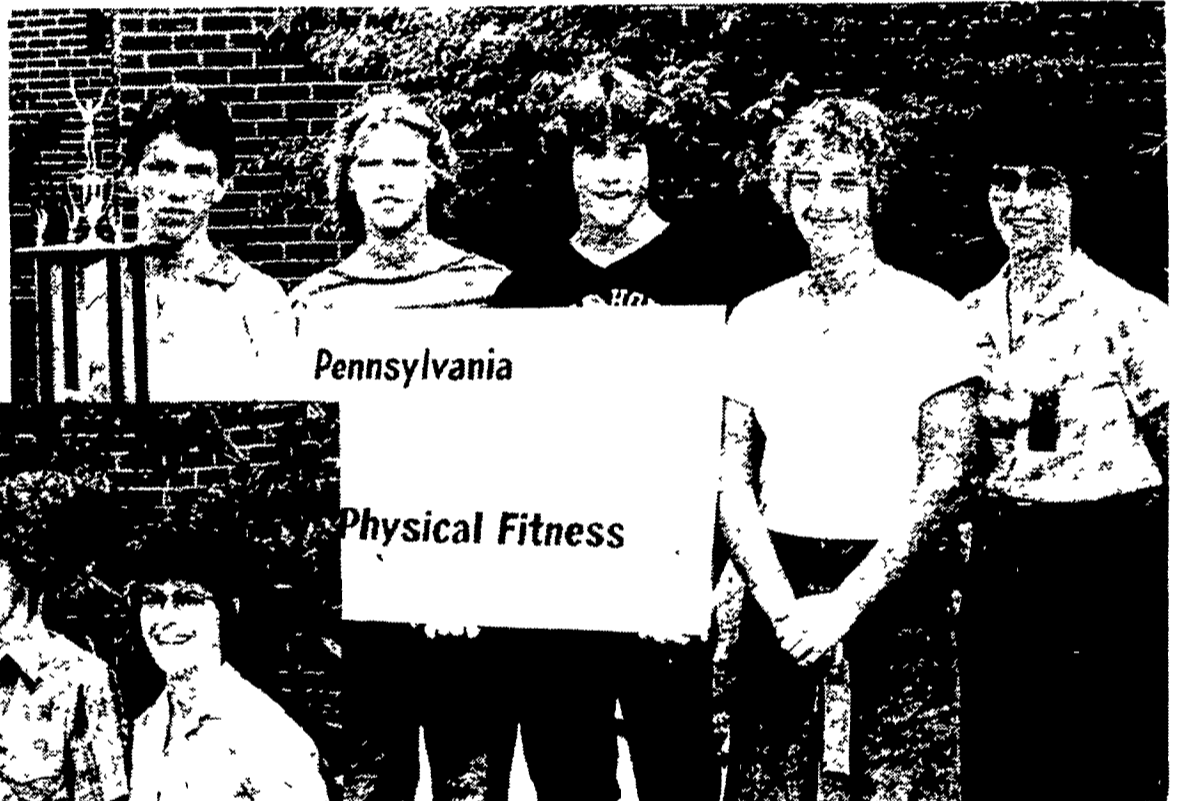
