AFBF travels to Mexico to talk ag exports

PARK RIDGE, II. — A delegation of U.S. farm leaders led by Robert B. Delano, president of the American Farm Bureau Federation, go to Mexico next week to explore possibilities of expanding agricultural exports to that nation.

Accompanying Delano will be Cecil Miller Jr., AFBF vice president and president, Arizona Farm Bureau; Carrol Chaloupka, president, Texas Farm Bureau; and Fred Heringer, president, California Farm Bureau. All are members of the AFBF board of directors. Glenn Tussey, AFBF staff specialist in international trade will coordinate delegate activities.

After conferring with Mexican and American agricultural, trade and government representatives in Mexico City, the group will travel to the state of Michoacan, a fertile and productive agricultural region west of Mexico City.

In Michoacan, the Farm Bureau team will visit agricultural, production, packing and trade areas and meet with processors, traders and farm organization officials. Stops are scheduled at farms producing a variety of

commodities, including rice, cotton, avocados, citrus fruits and horticultural crops.

In announcing the tour, Delano noted that Mexico has become an increasingly important trading partner for U.S. agricultural commodities. In 1980, Mexico purchased two and one-half billion dollars worth of U.S. agricultural crops — primarily corn, sorghum, wheat and oilseeds — making Mexico the world's third largest customer for American agricultural exports.

During the same year, the U.S. purchased about \$1.2 billion in agricultural commodities from Mexico, chiefly vegetables, coffee and livestock.

Delano said the Mexican visit is an extension of Farm Bureau's long established policy of export promotion.

"With an expanding population and substantial revenue from petroleum, Mexico has both the need for increased quantities of agricultural imports and the means to pay cash for them. U.S. farmers and ranchers have a locational advantage in supplying this growing cash market," Delano said.

Franklin Co. land survey progresses

CHAMBERSBURG — "The work on the National Resources Inventory is progressing well", says Charles Worrilow, soil conservationist with the Chambersburg field office of the USDA Soil Conservation Service.

"All the field work is done, except for some spot checking of a

percentage of the blocks", reports Worrilow.

Work on the inventory has been going on for about a year in Franklin County. There are 303 sample blocks of 108 acres each. Information gathered in these blocks will give an indication of how much cropland, pastureland, and forest land is being lost to urban sprawl.

"When we finish checking the information, it will be sent out for computer analysis. The results can then be used by planners from the Franklin County Conservation District.
