# N.Y. produce firm eligible to operate again

NEW YORK, N.Y. — D'Agostino Produce of Syracuse, N.Y. has become eligible to again operate in the produce industry. This determination was made by the U.S. Department of Agriculture Agricultural Marketing Service, which administers the Perishable Agricultural Commodities Act.

Charles Brader, an AMS official, said that the firm was reinstated under PACA because it paid two

reparation awards issued against it during May and July of 1981. The owner, Dominic D'Agostino and Giuseppe D'Agostino may also now be employed by PACA licensees without bond.

Under PACA, all interstate traders in fresh and frozen fruits and vegetables must be licensed by USDA. USDA is authorized to suspend or revoke a trader's license for violating the act.

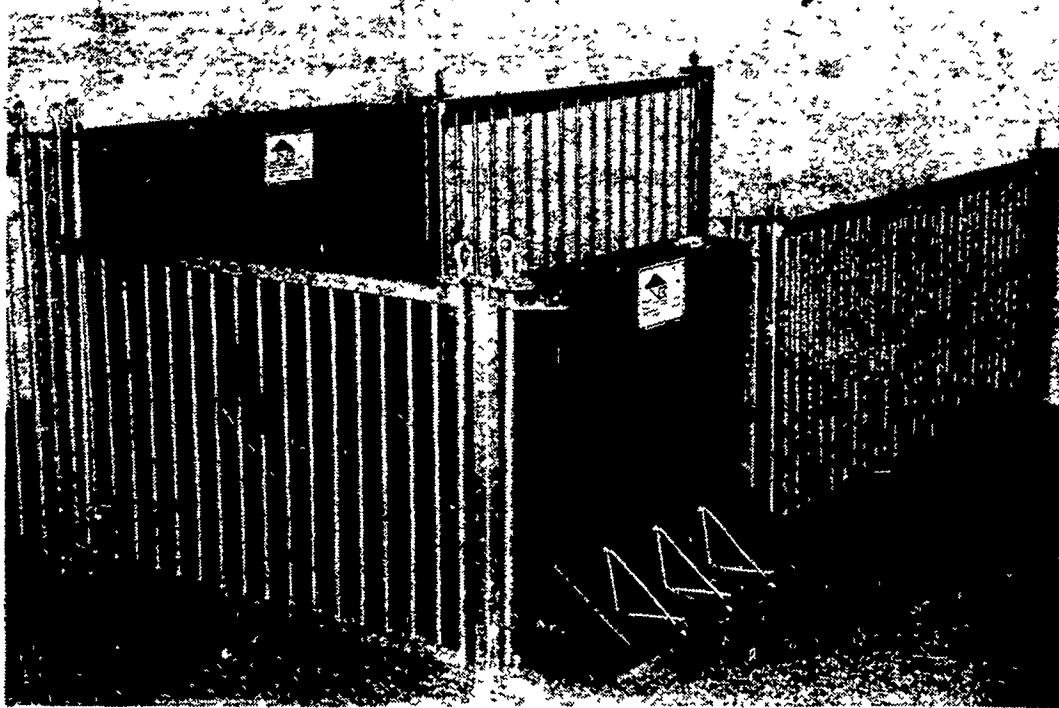
