Her efforts were recognized by the judge during the roundup as Sharon was awarded third place in both the Senior Hunter Equitation class and the Hunter Horse under 14.2 hands class.

The enthusiastic horsewoman also was a member of the second place county team, consisting of Jeanne Pierce, Jackie Brown, and Sharon.

Wood is Pa. ASC chairman

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Secretary of Agriculture John Block has appointed Jesse Wood of Nottingham as chairman of the Pennsylvania Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Committee. Named as committee members were Clyde R. Robison of Coal Center, and Annette Schucker of Troy. The committee administers federal farm programs in Pennsylvania.

Wood began his farming career with FFA while in high school and was in a dairy farm partnership with his father for more than 25 years. His business now includes his two sons.

He owns 244 acres in Lancaster County and farms approximately 400 acres of cropland. He has been on the Pennsylvania State Grange Agricultural Committee since 1974 and served as chairman in 1980-81. He was awarded the Keystone Farming Degree in 1950 and has served as an ASC Community Committee Chairman.

Robison was born and raised on his farm of 280 acres in Washington County and has always been a full-time dairy farmer. He is now in partnership with his son, farming a total of 400 acres and milking 100 registered Jerseys. He is past president of the Pennsylvania Dairy Herd Improvement

Association, National Dairy Herd Improvement Association, and American Jersey Cattle Club. He served for 14 years as an ASC Community Committeeman.

Schucker farmed with her husband for 21 years and in the 7 years since his death has managed the farm with hired help. The farm

of 213 acres in Bradford County has 36 milking registered Holsteins and 34 head of young stock. She is a member of the Pennsylvania Farmers' Association, the Eastern Milk Producers Cooperative, and has served on the Bradford-Sullivan County Board. She holds a R.N. from the Rochester School of Nursing, Rochester, New York.

Mendel suspended

NEW YORK, N.Y. — J. Roger Barber, commissioner of the New York State Department of Agriculture and Markets, permanently revoked the domestic animal health permit of Albert Mendel & Sons, Inc., a cattle dealer from Patterson, N.Y., on July 31.

In September, 1979, the commissioner had suspended the Mendel permit for two years and assessed a \$50,000 civil penalty because the dealer had engaged in various fraudulent practices, including submission of falsely identified blood samples for official testing.

In the determination signed July 30, the commissioner found that Mendel had used I.R. Meyers & Sons, Greenfield, Mass., as an out-

of-state front from which to continue cattle dealing in New York during the period the Mendel permit was suspended.

The state agency began the revocation proceeding on July 16, 1980, and designated an independent hearing officer, Robert J. McKennan, to preside. The hearing was held in 17 sessions from August, 1980, to April, 1981, and the hearing record consisted of more than 2,000 pages and 100 exhibits.

The hearing officer's report, recommending permanent revocation, was filed on June 8. Last August, the agency obtained a restraining order of the New York State Supreme Court barring Mendel from acting as a cattle dealer and that order will remain in effect.

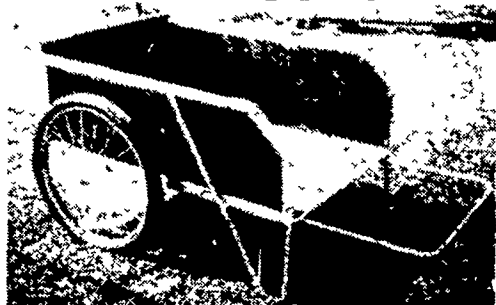
