Broiler placements drop

HARRISBURG - Placements of broiler chicks in the Commonwealth during the week ending August 22 were 2,042,000 according to the Pennsylvania Crop Reporting Service.

The placements were six percent below the corresponding week a year ago and two percent below the previous week. Average placements during the past nine weeks were one percent above a year earlier.

Placements in the 19 key poultry producing states were 76,585,000, ten percent above the same week a year ago but two percent below the previous week. Average placements in the 19 key states during the past nine weeks were seven percent above a year ago.






