Shattercane tour Tuesday

EAST EARL — The Eastern Lancaster County Adult Farmer Program, in cooperation with Stauffer Chemical Company, will conduct a tour of shattercane control test plots on Tuesday afternoon at 1:30 p.m.

This is the second year the Adult Farmer Program has been working with the control of shattercane in corn.

Shattercane is a problem weed in parts of Lancaster County. Herbicide combinations and important management practices to control this weed will be discussed and pointed out. In addition, sprayer

calibration and re-certification of pesticide applicator licenses will be covered. Persons needing private applicator license re-certification in 1981 should bring their old certification card with them.

The meeting will be conducted at the test plot located along Route 23, approximately 2 miles east of Blue Ball near the intersection of Route 625 North.

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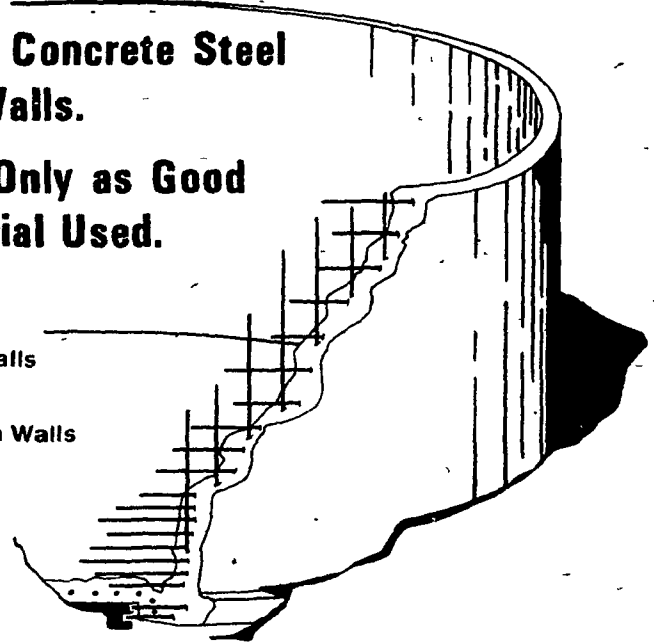
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
