Shattercane tour Tuesday

EAST EARL — The Eastern Lancaster County Adult Farmer Program, in cooperation with Stauffer Chemical Company, will conduct a tour of shattercane control test plots on Tuesday afternoon at 1:30 p.m.

This is the second year the Adult Farmer Program has been working with the control of shattercane in corn.

Shattercane is a problem weed in parts of Lancaster County. Herbicide combinations and important management practices to control this weed will be discussed and pointed out. In addition, sprayer

calibration and re-certification of pesticide applicator licenses will be covered. Persons needing private applicator license recertification in 1981 should bring their old certification card with them.

The meeting will be conducted at the test plot located along Route 23, approximately 2 miles east of Blue Ball near the intersection of Route 625 North.
