Md. ranks second in milk production, first in feed consumption .

COLLEGE PARK, Md. — Maryland led all states in the Northeast last year in feed concentrates fed per dairy cow and per 100 pounds of milk.

A survey John W. Wysong, Extension farm management specialists at the University of Maryland, also showed that unit costs for grain concentrates last year in the Old Line State were lower than for any other state in the Northeast except Pennsylvania.

In addition, Wysong noted, grain prices in Maryland typically are

low relative to forage prices, while farther north the reverse is trueexcept in Connecticut.

This situation created a favorable ratio last year of wholesale milk prices to on-farm feed costs. As a result, Maryland dairy farmers stepped up their feeding rate of grain and concentrates. This placed the state far ahead in the Northeast both in feed costs per cow and per 100 pounds of milk (standarized to 3.6 percent fat content).

Concentrate feed costs last year in Maryland averaged \$451.47 per

cow, compared with only \$205.45 per cow in New York and \$392.98 per cow in Pennsylvania. But these high feed costs for Maryland dairymen were largely offset by increased production per cow and a favorable government support price for fluid milk.

Last year's heavy over-all feeding rate helped to achieve some distinction for the state, Wysong observed.

Maryland is now second only to California in milk produced per cow among the five major milk-producing states: namely, Wisconsin, California, New York, Minnesota and Pennsylvania. These five states together produced more than 50 percent of the U.S. milk output in 1980.
