Forest said the hearing was requested by Michaels Dairies, Inc., a proprietary handler in Philadelphia. He said the proposals to be heard include:

Inclusion of all types of pool plants under the provision which provides that a supply plant meeting pooling performance requirements from September through February may be automatically qualified the rest of the vear.

→ Reduction from 40 percent to 30 percent of the percentage of receipts required to be disposed of as Class I milk by a pool distributing plant.

- Increase from 18 to 21 the number of dairy farmer's days of production that may be diverted to nonpool plants during any month of September through February.


