

Wayne County holds public sessions

HONESDALE — Candidates for local public office and other interested persons are invited to participate in a series of four educational meetings on powers, duties, and financial management of local government. The first session is scheduled for Wednesday, September 16, 8:00 P.M., in the Extension Meeting Room, Court House, Honesdale.

Speakers for these sessions will be Joseph Macialek, Community Development Agent, Pennsylvania State University, who will conduct a session on parliamentary procedure and meeting management. Theodore Alter and Diane Krautz, Community Economics Specialists, Pennsylvania State University, will

conduct sessions on taxation and finance; and attorney Lee C. Krause will speak on powers, duties, and procedures as prescribed by municipal and state codes.

The meetings are being sponsored by the Wayne County Cooperative Extension Service in cooperation with the Pennsylvania Department of Community Affairs. John E. Creighton, County Extension Director, points out that the information presented should be of special interest to candidates for public office. All candidates, public officials, and interested citizens are welcome. Subsequent sessions are scheduled for September 23, 30, and October 7.

During the pageant, the contestants were judged on their answers to an impromptu question and each contestant's three-minute presentation.

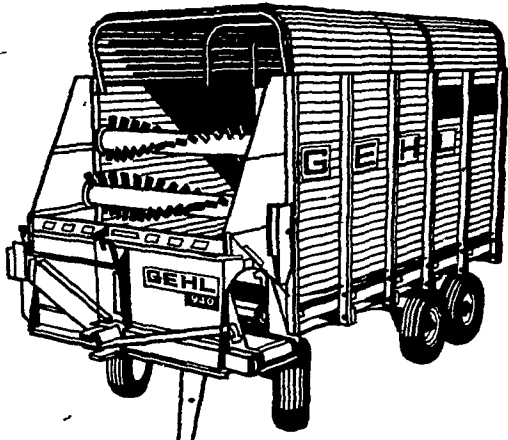
Prior to the crowning of the new dairy princess, 'outgoing princess

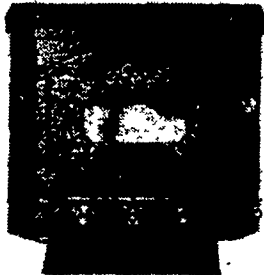

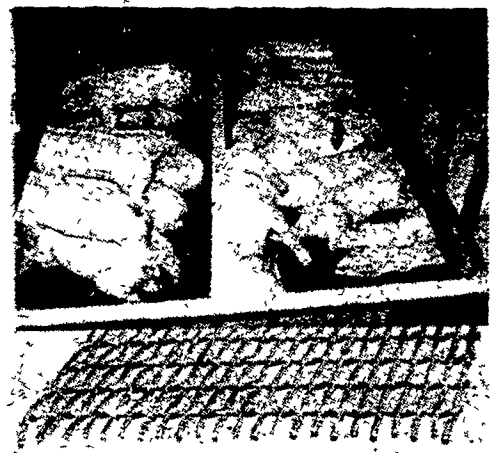
