ATHENS — The 3rd Annual 4-H Livestock Sale was held Monday, August 24, at the Valley Stockyards Inc., Athens.

According to Orville Yoder, County Agent, 21 buyers paid a total of \$6,494.98 for 32 4-H market animals. There were 3 steers, 12 market lambs and 17 market hogs in the sale raised by 22 4-H livestock club members.

The Grand Champion steer brought \$1.03 per lb. and was bought by Leona Meat Plant, Charles Deback, Troy. The champion steer was owned by Lisa Acampora, E. Canton 4-H.

Reserve Grand Champion steer was owned by Louis Acampora, E.

Canton 4-H and the buyer was Leona Meat Plant.

The Grand Champion Market Lamb was owned by James Eastman, Rome, N.E. Bradford 4-H Club. The lamb weighed 132 lbs. and the buyer N.E. Pa. Farm Credit, Lynn Chubbuck, Mgr., paid \$2.50 per pound for a total of \$330.

Reserve Grand Champion Market Lamb was shown by Jennifer Price, Hollenback 4-H Club, weighing 114 pounds and the buyer, Formula 1 Feeds, New Albany, paid \$2.30 per pound.

The Grand Champion Market Hog was shown by Michele Urevich, North Towanda 4-H Club, weighed 224 pounds and was purchased by Judsons Agway, Columbia Cross Rds., who paid \$2 per pound for a total of \$448.

Reserve Grand Champion Market Hog, shown by Jennifer Price, Hollenback 4-H Club, weighed 206 pounds and the buyer,

Richard Burgess, Meshoppen, paid \$2 per lb. for a total of \$412.

The three steers averaged 88 cents per lb.

Twelve market lambs averaged \$1.33 per lb.

Seventeen market hogs averaged .84 cents per lb.
