

## Apply for antlerless license Oct. 5

**HARRISBURG** — Antlerless deer license applications will be accepted from Pennsylvania resident hunters beginning Monday, October 5. Antlerless deer licenses are issued by county treasurers, and, according to law, "shall be issued without restriction or regard to the county residence of the Pennsylvania applicant."

When applying for an antlerless license, the hunter must mail the antlerless application to the county treasurer. The lone exception will be for applications to hunt antlerless deer in Potter County.

Persons requesting antlerless licenses are reminded:

Only the original antlerless deer license application form issued with the hunter's license shall be valid for making application.

No person is permitted to apply for more than one antlerless deer license under any circumstances.

The application cannot be transferred by the person receiving it or used by any other person to apply for a license.

County treasurers may accept applications by standard first class mail delivered through and by the U.S. Postal Service beginning Monday, October 5.

Applications must conform to the following regulations:

The form must be legibly completed in its entirety in accordance with printed instructions.

The application(s) must be mailed only in the official yellow envelope.

Not more than three applications may be submitted per envelope.

The appropriate pre-printed number on the outside of the envelope, indicating the number of applications enclosed, must be circled in ink.

The first and last name and legal home address of any one of the applicants must be printed on the front top left corner of the envelope.

The green "return" envelope, with sufficient first class postage affixed, and self-addressed to any one of the applicants must be enclosed with the application(s).

Remittance, at \$3.35 for each application, must be in the form of a negotiable check or money order payable to "County Treasurer." (Payable to "Pa. Game Commission" for Potter County antlerless licenses).

When more than one application is mailed in the same envelope, if any one of the applications fails to comply with regulations, all applications will be rejected.

Applications rejected for failure to close the

self-addressed, stamped green envelope will be put in a "dead letter" file and may be reclaimed only by contacting the county treasurer.

Antlerless licenses will not be issued by county treasurers before October 14. All licenses will be mailed to successful applicants no later than November 13.

A county treasurer

may elect to conduct a public drawing October 7 to select antlerless license recipients. If that option is elected, the county treasurer will notify local news media of the time and place of the drawing no later than September 17.

County treasurers are to return all unsuccessful applications at the earliest possible date, but in any event no

later than Friday, October 16, so the applicant may re-apply to another county where licenses are still available.


Any hunter whose application has been returned may change the county designation

where he or she wishes to hunt and re-apply there if unsold licenses are still available. When re-applying to another county, new official envelopes must be used and may be obtained from any hunting license issuing agent.

County treasurers may not accept or approve applications from nonresidents prior to 30 days before the opening

of the antlerless deer season in a particular county or special regulations area. Alien residents of Pennsylvania are defined as residents, while alien nonresidents are considered nonresidents.

Any antlerless deer license application which is submitted contrary to the instructions printed on the application or which is not legible or fully completed will be rejected.
